

Aalto SDG network – Why and what?


- Development programme during 2018, led by Aalto Sustainability Hub
- Societal impact by quality research
 - Aalto ENG responsible for Finnish water stewardship commitment, winlandtutkimus.fi
- Preparing for EU research financing, especially Horizon Europe
- Government (climate) budgeting and Agenda 2030/Commitment 2050
- We have to equip our students with SDG skills and capabilities
 - BIZ bachelors course spring 2018
 - Aalto IDBM course “Nordic Rebels”, focused in SDGs of city of Helsinki & Copenhagen
 - Noora Jaakkola’s master’s thesis *Teachers’ experiences of teaching SD in higher education*
- Synergy with stakeholders, activities & events
 - United Nations Technology Innovation Lab (UNTL) started also in Otaniemi
 - City of Espoo committed to SDGs
 - Sustainable campus by ACRE, Aalto Campus and Real Estate
 - Aalto communications & reporting, finance & investments
- SDG’s should guideline our future strategy for 2020-2035

New ranking based on SDGs, by Times Higher Education “THE”

- Showing how higher education is working towards the SDGs
- An opportunity to shine on aspects *not* covered in other rankings
- THE collaborating with Elsevier and Vertigo Ventures
- Will be open to all accredited universities that teach undergraduates
- 3 key areas of universities: research, stewardship (incl. teaching) and outreach, THE SDG metrics around these 3 parameters
- Includes 11 SDGs to start with, minimum 4 (incl. #17, Partnerships)
- Aim is to cover all 17 in the long run
- Data from Jan-Dec 2017, will be collected Oct-Dec 2018
- Results will be published in South Korea, 2-4 April 2019

Lifelong learning measures

4.iii

- a) Provide access to educational resources for those not studying at the university – eg computers, library, online courses, access to lectures, etc
 - Free access
 - Charged access
- b) Host events on campus that are open to the general public –
 - public lectures, community educational events
 - executive education programmes & capacity-building for business & government, vocational training
 - Both on an ad hoc or programmed basis
- c) Undertake educational outreach activities (e.g. tailored lectures or demonstrations) beyond campus – eg in local schools, in the community, including voluntary student-run schemes
 - On an ad hoc basis
 - As part of an ongoing planned programme
- d) Have a policy that ensures that access to these activities is accessible to all, regardless of ethnicity, religion, disability or gender
 - Provide the date the policy was created and last reviewed
