
OLLI V. LOUNASMAA MEMORIAL PRIZE 2004



The first Olli V. Lounasmaa Memorial Prize was awarded to Professor **John Clarke** from Berkeley University, USA, for his pioneering research and development work on ultra sensitive magnetometers called SQUIDs. Professor Clarke was elected for the Prize by an international Selection Committee of Professors **Mauri Airila** (vice rector of TKK), **Pekka Hautojärvi** (TKK), **Mikko Paalanen** (chairman, TKK), **Hans Ott** (ETH, Switzerland) and **Stig Stenholm** (KTH, Sweden). Helsinki University of Technology, Finnish Academy of Sciences and Letters, and the Finnish Cultural Foundation financially supported the Memorial Prize.

Professor Clarke gave a lecture *SQUIDs: From Cosmology to Magnetic Imaging in Microtesla Fields* on 7th of November 2004 in Helsinki University of Technology.
