Learning a new language is beneficial

- Language learning has many benefits:
 - it develops thinking skills,
 - enhances problem-solving skills,
 - increases creativity,
 - expands cultural perspectives,
 - and helps to understand the local culture, which in turn can make integration and social inclusion easier.

Why learn Finnish? 1/3

- Language is key to accessing information, understanding the local culture and being able to fully enjoy life in the country.
- Understanding of the local language promotes
 - a sense of belonging in the communities around you
 - and reduces feelings of being an outsider.
- Even basic knowledge of the local language makes it easier to navigate daily life and to build social connections.

Why learn Finnish? 2/3

- Over time Finnish language skills become more important, for example with finding employment here.
 - Finnish language skills are particularly important for career progression.
- Showing interest in learning the language and culture – and thus participating in the community – is appreciated by friends, colleagues and future employees alike.

Why learn Finnish? 3/3

- Perceptions of language skills: a means of communication or something you either can or can not?
 - Language learning is a gradual process.
 - Even basic knowledge of the language is knowledge of the language.
 - Adults tend to approach learning in an analytical and systematic manner which can be helpful as well...
 - ... but to learn a language, it's important to use it in real-life situation, ask for help, embrace mistakes, and learn from them.

Tips for learning Finnish

- Begin learning right away. (For example, change the language of your phone to Finnish!)
- 2. Use Finnish every day start with baby steps aka words such as "*moi*" and "*kiitos*".
- Set clear goals for own learning what do you hope to achieve by learning Finnish? How can you achieve this?
- 4. Shape your own learning experience engage fully with the (language) resources and opportunities around you.
- Remember that learning is a process be proactive, ask for support, embrace mistakes and learn from them. ©




Examples of the Finnish courses at Aalto
