


<sup>\*</sup>Programme studies in *International Design Business Management* 42 ECTS

<sup>\*\*</sup>In programmes Global Management and Strategic Management in a Changing World the scope of the thesis is 20 ECTS.

<sup>\*\*\*</sup> In Global Management the scope of elective studies is 12 ECTS. In *International Design Business Management compulsory minor is* 24 ECTS and elective studies 24 ECTS.

### Master's degree 120 ECTS

- The extent of the degree is min. 120 credits and can be exceeded by one course.
- Aim: 60 ECTS/year (~12 ECTS/period)
- No limitations on how many courses you can complete but you cannot include more than 120 cr (+ one course) to your degree.
- When graduating, your degree will include only the courses that are in your <u>study plan</u> – extra ones will be marked in your official study transcript.
- The elective studies of your degree can include a minor or individual courses. (Note. mandatory minor in IDBM programme / mandary exchange minor in Global Management programme).

# Creating a personal study plan (PSP) in Sisu

### Personal study plan (PSP) and enrollment for courses

### Planning & structure


- Includes study modules and courses in your degree
- PSP is changeable and helps you plan your studies
- Approved PSP ensures your plan meets degree requirements → finalized before graduation
- Preliminary PSP due at end of Period I (more information from Planning Officer)

### Course registration

- To register for courses, draft your PSP first. Note. Only adding a course to your study plan does not complete the course registration.
- PSP doesn't need to be approved before registration—just add planned courses
- Registration for most first-period courses ends Monday 25 August 2025




#### Instructions for planning your studies

An essential and required part of your studying at Aalto is your study planning. Planning your studies will give you the broad outlines of them in their entirety, helping you to build up your own competencies and expertise in the direction that interests you.

<u>The Universities Act (558/2009) (in Finnish)</u>, <u>Aalto's degree regulations</u> and your programme's curriculum determine a portion of your degree's content, while a portion can be chosen by you yourself according to your interests, goals and life situation. Your minor, thesis topic and elective studies are all examples of studies that you may quite freely plan. You may also decide to go on a student exchange programme or complete studies at other Finnish universities.









### Create a new study plan

- 1. You have been admitted through Master's admission to Aalto OR if you completed your BSc degree in Aalto but was admitted through Master's admission (IDBM, GM, CS).
  - → Choose the master's programme. Your study programme and version choices will be automatically for the current academic year when you create a new PSP.
- 2. You have completed your Bachelor's degree (Business) in Aalto Otaniemi OR Aalto Mikkeli (Internation Business)
  - → Choose your Bachelor's Programme/continue to use the same PSP
  - → Click on the first heading of your PSP and choose your MSc programme from the menu on the right.
  - → Change the academic year version of your MSc level studies







# Creating your study plan


- Make sure your PSP is marked as the "Primary plan".
   You can have other alternative plans, but you need to enroll to courses via your primary plan.
- Choose courses by choosing the module under which you want to add courses. The selection window opens on the right side.
- Choose courses according to the structure until the module says "selections done". Some modules require separate approval.
- Exchange studies, and inclusion of credit transfers are marked as study drafts.





### Applying for approval of the PSP

- Generally, only elective studies need to be approved (see below "approval required")
- If you have edited choices in the Free edit mode, you need to also apply for approval for a custom module
- Some minors may also require separate approval
- When the Planning Officer processes your request for approval, they also check that your entire PSP is made according to the degree requirements

# Course registration in Sisu

### **Course registration**

- Always enroll to courses via your study plan (PSP)
  - You need the current version of the course (2024-2025, 2025-2026) in your study plan
  - If needed, change the version course by course on the course brochure
- Pay close attention when enrolling for courses and check that your enrolment goes through
  - You do not need to enroll separately to the course exam (KT), but you need to enroll to the retake exam (T01, T02...)



### **Course enrolments**

### **Checklist**

- Register for courses in time!
  - → If you need to register after registration time has ended, be in touch with the courses' responsible teacher. Note. take into consideration that enrolling late for a course is not always possible.
- The compulsory requirements a course has (e.g. study right within a certain degree programme), prioritization criteria and enrolment period can be found in the course brochure.
- The time of registration does not define your chances of getting a seat on the course
  - → There may be a draw for remaining seats on a course with restricted number of seats.




## Course registration in Sisu

# 1. Open your primary study plan and choose/add the course to the PSP


Note. If a course is compulsory for your degree, it may automatically be included in your PSP.

You can add courses to each module from the side bar menu and/or at the search field



#### 2. Click on the course code


- ✓ Make sure you have the correct course version (i.e. current academic year)
- ✓ Go to Completion methods and select upcoming lecture/exam
- ✓ Proceed to registration via the upper blue bar

### Course registration in Sisu

- If the registration has direct confirmation, you have been accepted to teaching if you meet the basic conditions for registration.
- If only a certain number of students are accepted for the implementation, you are a candidate when you meet the conditions for registration.
- Registrations will be confirmed after the registration period has ended - no pre-approvals are made for getting a seat on courses

### **Credit transfer**

Inclusion and substitution of courses completed outside of Aalto

### **Credit transfer**

- Studies completed outside of Aalto University
- Either as
  - Substitution of an existing course
    - Mainly for compulsory or optional courses in your programme studies
    - Learning outcomes, level and content must be equivalent to the Aalto course
    - Substitution decision is made by the teacher responsible for the course
    - Grades are not transferred -> grade will be "pass"

#### OR

- Inclusion of courses
  - Mainly for optional and elective courses
  - Level must correspond, must meet the learning outcomes of the degree / study module
  - Grades transferred for studies completed in Finnish institution of higher education
- Note that credits in the degree giving you eligibility to your current programme cannot be transferred
- Accreditation of learning demonstrated in some other manner than formal education can also be a possibility. Please read more in Student Guide.



### When?

- Applying to substitute any period I courses
  - Submit your application latest on <u>18 August</u>
  - Decision will be made at the latest <u>by 1 September if all appendices are submitted latest</u> on 18 August

#### Other

- Applications are processed throughout the year
- Credits completed during the exchange are transferred after the exchange has finished




### How?

- In Sisu via study plan
- Needed appendices
  - Transcript of records

  - Certification of the study module being a study module in the university if applying for e.g. a minor




### Substitution of course

application







### **Inclusion of courses**

Apply for approval of the modified module, after you have done all the selections for it






# Inclusion of course(s)


After completing the studies, open the study draft and suggest credit

# Language studies New MSc students

### Requirements

According to the government decree a higher education degree must include proof of language skills:

**1. Skills in Finnish and Swedish**, that is required of personnel in the public sector (424/2003) 6 §;

And

**2. skills in at least one foreign language**, skills that will enable to follow the development in the own field and in international settings.

Requirements in point 1, does not apply to students who have received their school education in another language than Finnish or Swedish, neither students who have received their school education outside of Finland. In these cases, the university will decide the language requirements.





## Am I required to complete language studies?

# If you have completed a Bachelor's degree or university of applied sciences degree in Finland

➤ No, you do not need to complete language studies in your Master's degree, since you have included the required language studies in your previous degree.

# If you have completed your school education in Finland, but your Bachelor's degree outside of Finland

Yes, you are required to demonstrate your proficiency in your language of education (Finnish or Swedish), other national language (Finnish or Swedish) as well as a foreign language 3 ECTS (usually English). You may be able to apply for exemption of demonstrating proficiency in national languages.

### If you have completed all school education and your Bachelor's degree outside of Finland

➤ You are required to include min. 3 credits of Finnish or Swedish (can be a beginner level course) or English.



### **Questions?**

- If you are still uncertain about the language requirements after reading the email, you can reply to the email and ask for further instructions

The language studies must be included in the study plan and in the degree but can exceed the minimum credit amount for your degree.
