

Privacy Notice to participants of the Research Data Management and Open Science and Research Information Management (ACRIS) -related Surveys

You have been invited to participate in a survey. Participation in the survey is voluntary. You can discontinue your participation at any time. Should you discontinue your participation, you will not be subject to any negative consequences. This privacy notice describes how we use of your survey answers.

1. What is the purpose of processing of survey data?

The surveys conducted by the Open Science and ACRIS Team fall into three categories 1) Research Data Management and Open Science Training user satisfaction surveys, 2) surveys exploring the state-of-the-art of the research data management and open science practices at Aalto University and 3) surveys related to the Open Science and Research Information Management (ACRIS) system. In all of the cases, the survey results will be used to develop the Research Data Management and Open Science services of Aalto University. The survey results may also be published as internal and external reports, communications and scientific publications. No personal data is used in any decision-making related to the survey participants.

Survey is sent to course and workshop participants and other persons who may be relevant respondents to questions about the quality of service or communication needs of ACRIS.

2. How is personal data minimized in the study? Data anonymisation and storage?

The survey will be conducted anonymously. The email addresses used to invite the survey respondents will be deleted one month after the survey deadline. Should there be responses that can be used to identify individuals either directly or indirectly (e.g. open-ended questions), such indirect or direct identifiers will be removed from the survey results prior to data analysis, and subsequently data is anonymised prior to the publishing or storage of the survey results.

3. Legal basis for processing of personal data

The lawful purpose for processing personal data is that processing is necessary for the purposes of the legitimate interests to develop the Research Data Management and Open Science and research Information Management services of Aalto University.

4. Sharing of Personal Data

No personal data is shared with third parties.

5. Transfer of Personal Data to Non-EU/EEA countries

No personal data is transferred to non-EU/EAA countries.

6. The rights of the data subject

According to the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR), subjects have the right:

- to obtain information on the processing of their personal data
- of access to their data
- to request rectification of their data
- to request restricting the processing of their data
- to object to the processing of their data
- right to erasure, if the grounds of article 17.1 of GDPR apply and if processing is no longer needed for archiving purposes in the public interest, scientific or historical research purposes

or statistical purposes in accordance with Article 89(1) in so far as the right to erasure is not likely to render impossible or seriously impair the scientific research.

If the purposes for which a controller processes personal data do not or do no longer require the identification of a data subject by the controller, the controller shall not be obliged to maintain, acquire or process additional information in order to identify the data or the data subject for the sole purpose of complying with the GDPR. If the controller cannot identify the data related to a data subject, the rights of access, rectification, objection and erasure shall not apply, except if the data subject provides additional information enabling his or her identification and the identification of the research data that relates to data subject.

To exercise his or her rights, the data subject should contact follow the steps outlined in section 7.
