Learning outcomes

The course will construct a systemic understanding of the change needed while transforming the current linear economy towards circular economy. A circular economy is a powerful way to address climate change, resource scarcity, and biodiversity loss while also meeting critical social needs. The focus of the course will be on how to prevent waste and pollution, how to keep products and materials in use longer and how to regenerate the whole system towards a better balance.

The learning outcomes include following:

- Understanding the need for system transformation towards circular economy,
- Understanding the role of design in driving a systemic circular transformation,
- Modular thinking, prefabrication and design for deconstruction as tools or strategies for designing sustainable products,
- Understanding the importance of users/consumers in adoption of circular thinking, and
- Building scenarios and paths towards desired future.

Social Program

Of the two intensive weeks of program, two days (6.–7.8.) are spent in a beautiful Nuuksio National Park. Naturally, we also want to offer the possibility to sauna. Feel free to plan your own activities or just enjoy the nature and Finnish summer eve by swimming in the lake, sitting by a bonfire or just walking in the forest together with other summer school partners.
