## LAYOUT

Please find the InDesign file *doa\_thesis\_poster*

Each thesis will be exhibited on one poster and possible additional material like the thesis book (not mandatory) and scalemodels. The space for the exhibition is limited and the content depends on the quantity of submission.

The role of the poster is to function as a teaser or pitch to make visitors take a close look on your thesis at Aaltodoc.

### Paper size

w600 x h860 mm  
including 50 mm top and bottom foldings

### Print content

w540 x h480  
(red rectangle on top part of the print)

Please collect a narrow selection of most attractive points of your thesis here. It can be images, drawings, graphs and/or models.

Use high quality raster images and vector drawings. If the most attractive part of your thesis is a scalemodel, you can use that.

### Text

The length of the text on bottom part of the print is limited to 2000 characters.

As a text description you can use the abstract or write new one. Just consider what suits best for the purpose.

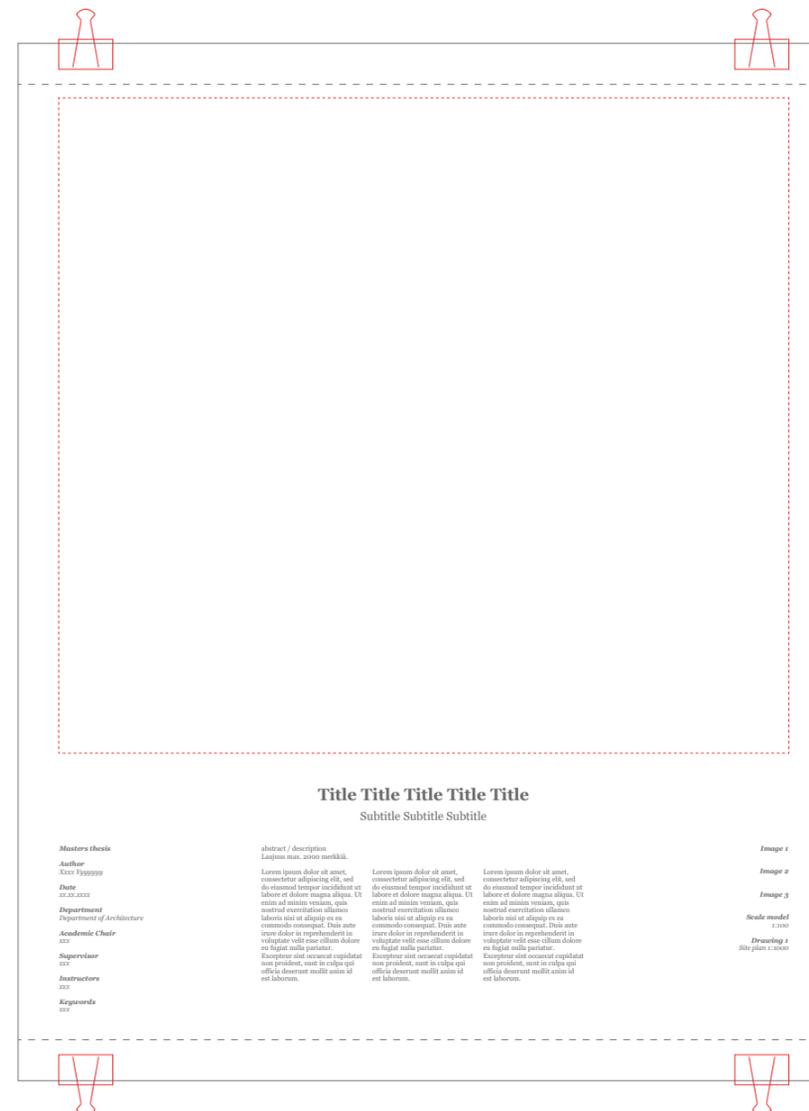
Please keep the font and font size as they are in InDesign file.

## SUBMITTING THE FILE & PREPARING THE PRINT

**1**  
Export your poster in Press Quality .pdf from InDesign.

Name your file like this:  
*doa\_thesis\_poster\_lastname\_irstname*

**2**  
Upload thesis printing files to a Google Drive folder. The link to the folder will be shared with you the day after of the thesis 's submission deadline at eAge system

In order to use a shared folder create an account in Google Drive with Aalto University user ID.

**3**  
Pick your print from PrintLab before you go to present your thesis and prepare it for the exhibition.

Cut your poster in size following the crop marks.

**4**

**5**

Find 5 mm mark lines 50 mm below the top corners of the print.

**6**

Make a neat folding from top mark to top mark.

It's easiest to use sturdy rulers at the PrintLab and make "a creasing", a gentle groove line, on the paper before folding. To make the creasing, use "bone folder", round end stick or similar tool and to beware of breaking the paper.

**7**

Take your print on the exhibition table and check your spot together with other students and by the instructions on the next page.

**8**

Line the creased fold with top edge of the table top and fold the remaining part over the table edge.

If your spot is in the center of the table, remove the lamp and the clamp in advance.

**9**

Fix the top with the paper clips as shown in the drawing.

**10**

Straighten the print and pull the bottom part gently towards you while folding the end over the table edge.

**11**

Clip the bottom.

If you removed the lamp, fix it back in the center of the table.
