Simulations have become increasingly commonplace in undergraduate business programs. Computer-based simulations in particular aim to provide an operating representation of the central features of reality (Guetzkow.1963) by imitating a system, entity, process, or phenomenon (Lean et al., 2006). A simulation can be a powerful learning tool in a capstone course, which is intended to help students integrate knowledge gained in function-related courses such as marketing or operations management.

Stephen et al. (2002) describe the need for integration in this way: "Through the major courses, professors help develop accountants, financial analysts, operations planners, and marketing specialists—strong and tall figurative trees of different varieties. However, it is not until they are all brought together in the capstone course that students can begin to see a 'forest.'" Indeed, the integration of the trees into a forest is one of the main goals of a capstone course in business policy or strategy. The wide variety of pedagogical approaches used in such capstone strategic management courses speaks to the notion that integration may be taught in many ways. However, the measurement of whether we are achieving integration in those classes remains a somewhat elusive topic.

Skilful Writing and Prevention of Plagiarism

Turnitin is a tool for enhancing skilful writing and preventing plagiarism. In practise, it is a submission inbox for papers. Turnitin checks texts against comparison databases (repositories) for similarity and generates a similarity report. Comparison databases include: web pages, student papers and library databases and publications. *The similarity report shows similarities, it does not identify plagiarism. The reports have to be interpreted.*

Turnitin is also used to give feedback and grades.
