

Scholarships for Pathway students admitted as degree students at Aalto University through the separate admissions for Pathway students in admissions 2024

Aalto University's tuition-fee levels and the main principles of its scholarship system were confirmed by the university president's decision on 30 May 2016. The vice president for education confirmed the policies for implementing the tuition fee and scholarship system on 29 November 2016. Further details on the scholarship system, including programmes' scholarship budgets, are confirmed by the vice president annually. This annual decision will be supplemented with scholarship guidelines for students accepted in the bachelor's programme through The University Pathway Finland programme.

Aalto University, together with Tampere University and University of Oulu, is offering digital pathway studies to international students. The University Pathway Finland (Economics) programme is part of the International Programme funded by the Ministry of Education and Culture. The extent of the University Pathway Finland is 30 ECTS, and it consists of studies in mathematics (3 courses, 15 ECTS), programming (1 course, 5 ECTS), Finnish language and culture (2 courses, 5 ECTS), and English language (1 course, 5 ECTS). Students who complete the pathway courses at the required level and meet the other admissions criteria will get an offer from the Bachelor's programme in Economics at Aalto University.

In the separate admissions 2024, I decide that the scholarships are allocated to accepted students from the Pathway programme based on the average grade in the mathematics and programming courses included. The scholarship criteria are the following:

- GPA of mathematics and programming courses: 3.50-3.99: no scholarship
- GPA of mathematics and programming courses: 4.00-4.49: 50% scholarship
- GPA of mathematics and programming courses: 4.50-5.00: 100% scholarship

The scholarships for students accepted through the above stated separate admissions are not included in the annually decided scholarship budget of the Bachelor's Programme Economics. This group has separate scholarship criteria and budget, which are evaluated annually.
