Otaniemi is a blend of natural peace and urban buzz






Everyday life at Aalto

- Through our exchange programme, you get to study in the best business schools around the world!





- You have access to training, classes, a mentoring programme, coaching, online resources, job fairs, career events with alumni, and more.




Exchange studies at Aalto University

ullet

Semester is divided into teaching periods:

- Autumn term (Sept-Dec): Period I and II
- Spring term (Jan-May): Period III, IV and V
- Every teaching period is followed by examination week
- Note: Not all the courses include a final exam (assessment can be continuous)
- Courses for exchange students

- As long as the student meets the prerequisites, bachelorlevel students can take master-level courses



Applying to bachelor's programmes in English at Aalto University

- Aalto University offers 8 English taught bachlor's programmes in all three fields.
- Admission to these programme is organized once a year, typically in January for studies starting in August-September of that year.

Applying to Master's programmes at Aalto University

- Aalto University offers over 90 master's programmes in English in all three fields.
- Admission to master's programmes is organised once a year. Typically, applications are open in December-January each year for studies starting the following August-September.

Get ready to apply

- 1. See Aalto's study options and decide which programmes interest you the most: aalto.fi/programmes
- 2. Read the admissions requirements carefully on our website and prepare for your application well ahead of time.
- 3. Book and take a standardised language test, if required in the admissions requirements.
- 4. Check if you are required to submit other specific application documents for your programmes, such as standardised test results (SAT, ACT, GMAT or GRE), official translations, references, or portfolios.
- 5. Apply during the application period and submit all application documents.
